## Bike Week Cork School Event Criteria

Cork City Council and Cork County Council have secured funding from the National Transport Authority to support a limited number of participatory cycling events during National Bike Week. This fund will be administered by Cork Sports Partnership on their behalf. Schools are invited to apply for funding to organise their own **FREE Bike Week** event during Bike Week.

The scale and scope of your National Bike Week event is up to each applicant. However, applications that focus on the following event criteria will be more positively received and prioritised:

### School Event Criteria:

- ✓ The event **MUST** take place during within 9th-17th May 2026
- ✓ The Event must be **FREE** to take part in.
- ✓ Fun Cycles, Slow Bike Races, Cycling Obstacle Courses, Nature Cycles, Cycle to School Days, Lunch Time Cycles, Cycling Games and Activities. These events can be complimented by Arts and Craft classes with a cycling theme, workshops & safety talks from Gardaí, RSA, local bike shops etc. but cannot form the whole of the event. - ✓ Focus of inclusion, non-competitive, community focus, family, local school participation.
- ✓ Funding can not be used on the Cork Cycle Right Schools Programme.
